BELF is the use of English as the medium of communication among speakers of different first languages in an emergent, variable and hybrid manner that is appropriate to the demands and (multilingual) resources of the specific business context.



You are much more likely to be working with non-native than native speakers of English!

Non-native speakers can have very high or very low proficiency → Flexible language use is key!

Common corporate language (English)/"official English"

- top-down management policy
- oriented to Standard English norms
- used for **official** external & internal communication
- **shared & hybrid**; inherently potentially **multilingual**, including professional & functional languages
- performative/constituent of interactional processes and relationships
- emergent & ad hoc language practice
